
## I AM GOING TO ABILITY TREE!

I can see what the building looks like from the bus window before we cross the stone bridge. It helps me to get ready for my stop by watching for the green & brown stripes on the top!


The bus driver brings me to the front door. I see an Ability Tree buddy standing there, ready to walk with me into the building. This keeps me feeling safe!











This tree-house looks like fun! It has beanbag chairs and books for me to read. It is a nice quiet space.



Center gets too loud for me.




Sometimes spaces with a lot of friends get noisy, but I am ok! The Sensory Room is a safe, quiet place for me to go if the




