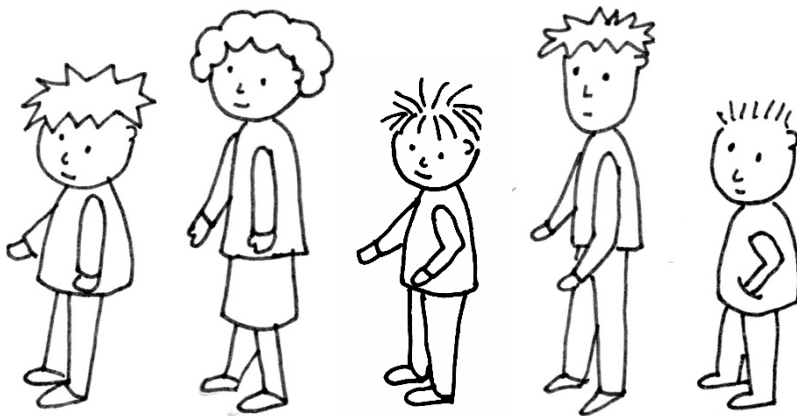


What is lining up?

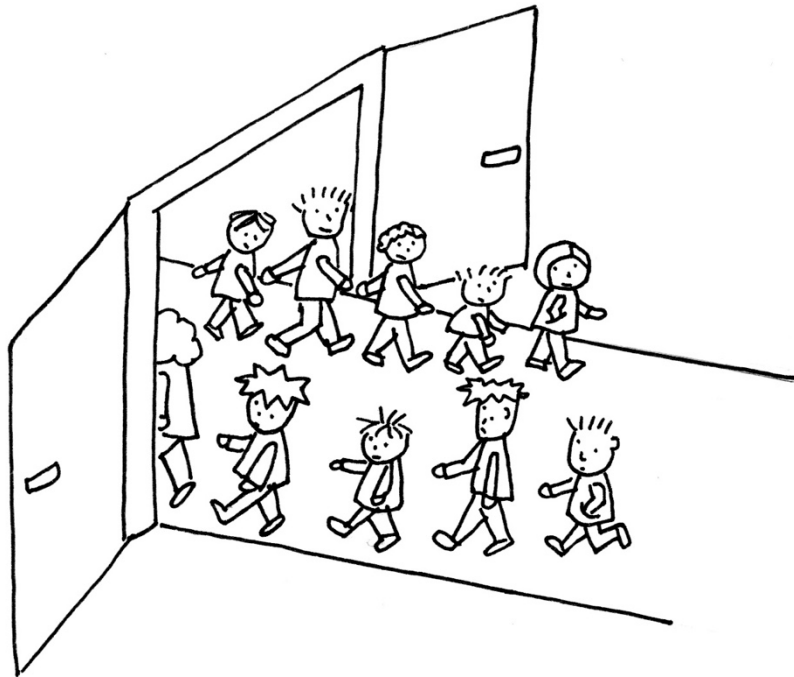
A teacher usually watches break time to keep us safe. When break time is finished the teacher usually blows a long whistle. This means it is time to stop playing and stand in a line.



Standing in a line with one child behind another child is called lining up. Each class lines up together. This is OK.



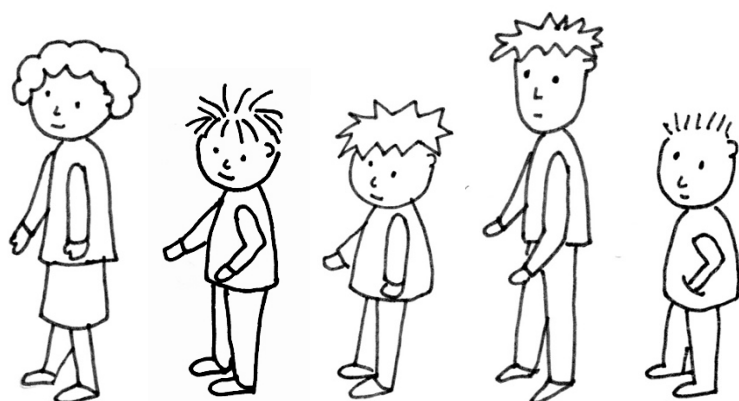
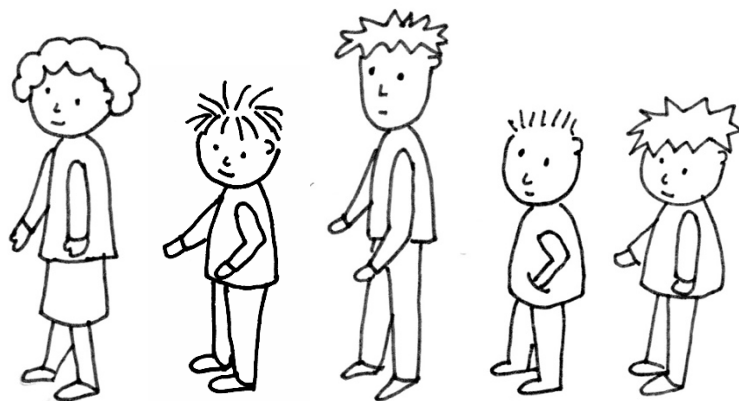
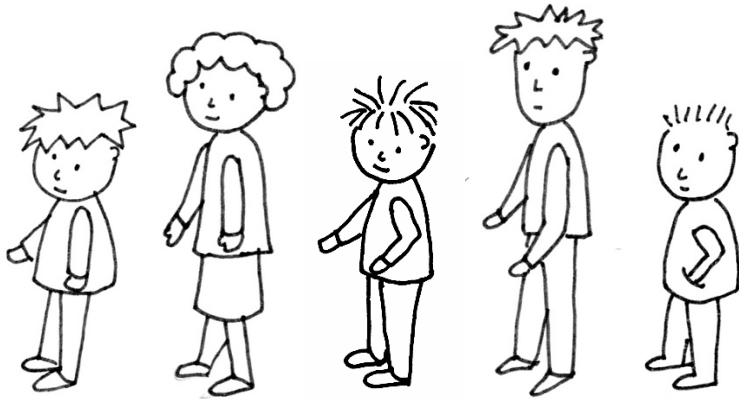
When children walk in a line they may pass by another line of children without bumping each other. Walking in a line is a safe way for lots of children to move along corridors and through doorways.



Walking in a line is a safe way for lots of children to go back into school. To walk in line children need to stand in a line first. The teacher is pleased when the children line up.

Sometimes I will be at the front of the line. Sometimes I will be at the end of the line. Sometimes I will be somewhere in the middle.

This is ok.



My place in the line will depend on when I joined the line.

I will try and line up at the end of break time. My teacher will be pleased with me
